[00:00:11] Heather: [00:00:11] running through the finish line.

[00:00:13] Sister Miriam: [00:00:13] can you believe that? We're running all the way through. We're not stopping a few feet before the finish line. We are running all the way through. All right.

[00:00:18] So yeah. And here we are. Can you guys, we were just talking about that. We're like, what episode is this? We are on the last, this is it,

[00:00:24] Heather: [00:00:24] 24, 24, just since January, we have. Gone strong way to go

[00:00:31] Sister Miriam: [00:00:31] Yeah, that's so true. Michelle, what about you? Can you believe that?

[00:00:35] Michelle: [00:00:35] Yeah , I'm running through, through the finish line, but then I'm collapsing on that.

[00:00:40] **Heather:** [00:00:40] you like water?

[00:00:41] Michelle: [00:00:41] Oh, water. Seriously.

[00:00:42] We are feeding

[00:00:43] Sister Miriam: [00:00:43] her Starburst jelly beans at the end. We're like.

[00:00:45] Michelle: [00:00:45] Seriously. I need some electrolytes here. People like, come on, give me my banana, give me my, everything that you're supposed to get at the end of a race. And so,

[00:00:52] Sister Miriam: [00:00:52] So, yeah, in light of where we've been since January 20th was our first episode on the good soil and we, gosh, we've gone, we've gone so many places. The world has gone so many places since January 20th. And here we are. So we thought what we do is just spend some time sharing with you some of our favorite memories of, and some of our favorite episodes of the season.

[00:01:10] And maybe it also inspire you to either listen again, or check out an episode. You haven't checked out yet. We also want to talk about where we are with our word for the year, and we just want to offer you a final, just a parting word for the summer. As we kind of face so much, discord in the, in the world and what's happening.

[00:01:24] We just want to offer our hearts for you and what the Holy Spirit's doing there as well. So. Michelle. What about you? I remember recording the good soil our first episode of the year, and I was literally in Chicago and it was like 20 below zero in Chicago and that the good soil and the Bareness, which I lobbied for the title of being the Baroness of Winter.

[00:01:41] I, I didn't, I didn't win. It ended up being the bareness, but what were some of the, maybe in January, February for you, Michelle, before we started our Linton book study, what were some of your favorite episodes or just kind of the thoughts that you had about that time?

[00:01:54] Michelle: [00:01:54] Yeah. the Lord, very often speaks to me like how we've created things and things in ministry in garden terms. So there's just so much, and he's done that throughout scripture and throughout the writings of different saints and mystics and all this kind of stuff with the good soil.

[00:02:07] But just realizing now where we are in the state of the world, like, okay, like, what are the questions that I keep on asking myself is , what seeds of my planting and what seeds am I I'm sewing really? You know, we're just like we were talking about like the discord and the disunity within the church.

[00:02:24] Just social media is just a really hard one. And then just in the world, you know, and one of the questions I keep on asking myself, am I sowing seeds of peace? Or am I sowing seeds of discord? And really allowing myself to keep on going back to, what kind of a seeds am I sewing and what kind of fruit am I producing?

[00:02:44] And is there bad fruit and where do I need to be pruning? And I think this is a conversation that we constantly have to be having with ourselves. So like those first two episodes in January are two, to really go back and visit abiding versus striving and the good soil, because these are questions that are not a one time thing question. These are questions that have to be asked of our hearts and our souls continuously, you know, because that is the refining purifying process of the Christian life. What about you, Heather?

[00:03:13] **Heather:** [00:03:13] And I would also say like, yeah, ask ourselves. And that we need to be willing to ask one another, those questions sometimes like sometimes a friend is, just out of place a little bit, they're not operating out of the fruits of the spirit and there might be something out of sync and as a close friend to be able to go in love and humility and say, I love you friend, but can, can you help me understand what's going on here?

[00:03:33] Because this is what it looks like. And to have a conversation about it and openness, we don't want to make assumptions about people, but this is part of journeying with one another to help one another grow in holiness and to not think that we're always right, but to humbly come alongside of one another.

[00:03:49] I think that's, that's wonderful. I love the episode that we did, from the focus conference called made for mission. Yeah, we were in this little VW van, which was so cute and funny, but we couldn't hear a darn thing. the whole, it was so loud because there was so many people in this huge hall. but yeah, that, that particular conversation I thought was just jam packed. I personally learned a lot from that conversation and it was a lot about personal holiness and that's something that I just keep coming back to over and over and over again, with everything has been so tumultuous going on in our world. I keep coming back to, what can I do? I can't change some of these things right now in the snap of a finger, but I can allow the Holy spirit to change me.

[00:04:33] I can allow the Holy Spirit to refine me. And there are parts in me that are, like you said, causing discord or participating in certain things that are not okay. And I was about

to have a meeting with someone, and it was going to be a very hard conversation and there was a lot of relational disruption. And a lot of division that was going on. And I was like, okay, the enemy is fully at work here, but also we are as, as human beings, I've added to the discord or whatever, by my assumptions and my judgments. And so anyway, I was praying in the shower as I do. And I was like, Oh, Holy Spirit, you know, just bring peace to the situation.

[00:05:10] And I just felt, as I was praying like that, like for God to come into the conversation that I was about to have, I just felt this gentle voice of the Spirit say, Heather, why don't you ask that? I come into you. That I bring peace into you, that you be the conduit of that peace, that it doesn't just come into the situation per se, but that you open wide your heart, to have peace and that it come from you that when you speak, it's my peace that when you act it's my peace, when you don't speak, when you don't get defensive, that it's my peace working in you.

[00:05:42] And I was like, okay, that's next level? I was being convicted, you know, and I wanted to, you know, also start singing. Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me because you know, sometimes those things yeah. Which I did in the shower. No. which those things can sound trite sometimes, but it's true.

[00:05:59] It's so, so true. If I'm not willing to let it begin with me, then I have no right to go telling other people what to do or judging people on platforms or ranting about whatever. Like I need to let it begin with me, in the smallest situations. Like that's the mother Teresa quote, you know, you want to change the world, go home and love your family.

[00:06:19] Like it's so, so true. You begin with what's right around you and you move from there.

[00:06:25] Sister Miriam: [00:06:25] Hmm,

[00:06:26] Heather: [00:06:26] Yeah.

[00:06:26] Sister Miriam: [00:06:26] gosh, both of you, that's such great stuff and isn't that so true. And so often we want to clean up everybody else's side of the street. the only side of the street we can clean up is our own that's it? You know, and that's something that we, we would do well to continue just to ponder in our own hearts and our own souls.

[00:06:42] And it was so much fun to be with y'all at the SLS conference. That was a lot of fun. We had us with our 10,000 of our closest friends and, I,

[00:06:51] Sister Miriam: [00:06:51] I know, we're like, I remember when we used to gather together before we didn't do that anymore. That's what we do now. We don't do that anymore, but, I also really liked the episode on gathering people, which I know is really close and for each of you, I mean for myself as well, but you guys just set a good table on it. And if people haven't seen it yet, Heather, can we just give a shout out to your salmon wellington video that you made? It is so stinking cute. And like, I want her to come over right then and there and you set the table.

[00:07:12] You were just, it was like, you shouldn't get your own show on the cooking channel. And I mean, then Michelle's like, you should have a Judah do one with you that

would bring the house down. Can we just talk about that? Like you're talking about gathering people and then. When we had the Father, Josh Johnson on who was all our personal favorites, I mean, he just talked about the power of the Holy hour and that's something as well that this summer

[00:07:31] Sister Miriam: [00:07:31] that we do take in as churches do begin to open.

[00:07:32] And maybe we do have just a different time schedule just to be able to really take advantage of that, to go sit with the Lord, when we can, to ask for his grace and to ask for that the transformation, to begin with with each one of us. and then we dove into our Lenten book study, which was Epic.

[00:07:48] **Heather:** [00:07:48] That was awesome. Yeah. Michelle, that was another episode that stood out to you.

[00:07:53] Michelle: [00:07:53] I loved, Seek it was a blast. I have to just give a shout out to all the college kids, like your zeal and your, just your heart was beautiful. And, we just love speaking with you. I was having this conversation with a friend of mine that both of us disciple a lot of college kids in 20 somethings.

[00:08:08] And we really feel like that your generation is a generation that is going to bring the church into some fullness and that you all are going to do some amazing things and that you all are actually going to be the ones that can live in this tension that we are in where it's not an either or church, but it's a both/and, and bring us into the fullness of the church. Where we're very rooted in scripture and tradition, but we are a church of. Justice and charity and peace and love and all of the good things. And I just think that you all are going to really probably be the generation to do it. And I'm putting that on you because my kids are gonna come right after you.

[00:08:43] So y'all just opened those doors and do all that. And, I love the gathering people when, like you said, and, like, cause that's just such a thing in my heart. I love to gather people. I love to set a table. Heather can cook, I'll just set the table. But, you know, but like sister said, the power of the Holy hour is a really important thing.

[00:09:01] I think if there's one grace, yes, it's the power of the Eucharist and the sacraments are very beautiful in my spiritual life, but one of the things that I hold fast to his, my Holy hours. And it was one of the hardest things when COVID started that I did not have my Holy hours. And then I was able to get mine back earlier than anticipated

[00:09:20] and just that time with the Lord, if you want to be able to hear the Shepherd's voice, if you want it to be able to hear the bridegroom's voice, get in his gaze, get in his eyesight to be able to look at him, have him look at you.

[00:09:33] And this is the place to quiet your heart and quiet your mind. And it is just a place for his love to be, illuminated, you know, in your life. And, I love it because it's a place that's quiet and my cell phone is off and nobody can get to me. Mama's in Holy hour and nobody can find me

[00:09:52] so yeah, those are my couple things and Return of the Prodigal son. It was just Epic in itself. Heather, what about you?

[00:09:57] Heather: [00:09:57] Yeah, what you're saying about a Holy hour, you can't replace what it is to be in the physical presence of Jesus, in the blessed sacrament. And I would also say like, for me, I still haven't been able to go to mass. I'm living with people who are a high risk. And so I haven't received the Eucharist in a long time and we haven't had Holy hours and my heart aches for that.

[00:10:19] And if you aren't able to go like that doesn't mean that you can't deeply connect with the Lord and sit in his gaze. And no, it doesn't replace physically being in his presence, but God is kind and he wants to meet us exactly where we are. So I would just encourage you if you're in that place to just create a prayer space in your home.

[00:10:39] It can be very, very simple. It can be in a corner somewhere, just a little wall where you put a chair, like anywhere that you create a sacred space to commune with the Lord, it's really, really important. I loved our episode with Bishop Barron, like that was a tremendous gift to have him on, obviously we had this wonderful conversation, but it was hilarious.

[00:10:57] Like after we got off the call, we were like, what just happened? it all worked out the, and praise the Lord, but gosh, those things keep us humble and laughing, you know, but

[00:11:07] that conversation with him was wonderful. I mean to just listen to him and sit at his feet to talk about beauty and he's so human, so real. so if you haven't listened to that one yet, I'd recommend it.

[00:11:18] Michelle: [00:11:18] Oh, yeah, he was so personable and so funny. And just like I loved when he, got like little heated up about was funny. Like, you know, he was, he was just really great sister, what were you gonna say?

[00:11:28] Sister Miriam: [00:11:28] I think, when we looked at this last season, we've had so many beautiful guests on and just a lot of rich things. And I, you know, when we look to lent to the book study that we did and when we prayed the stations of the cross with people and it's like, One of the things I keep thinking of is how many people on our Facebook page said, you know, I read Henry Nouwen's book years ago and I haven't picked it up since, and it was so beautiful to revisit it.

[00:11:46] it was so beautiful to go back and see now where I am and what the Lord is saying about the younger son, the older son, the father, and like what the Lord? And that's the beauty of a timeless. A timeless work is that you can pick it up at any time and you can read it again and see it with new eyes.

[00:12:01] And so like, that's the beauty of revisiting things like that, whether it's for the Jacques Philippe or, whatever that is for us, that the continual growth of our hearts. And, I was just happened to be praying with somebody recently and they, and it was a video prayer call and it was very beautiful because they just so happened to be sitting right in front of Rembrandts painting of the prodigal son. And I don't think they even meant to, but I said, can I just point this out to you? this is exactly what's happening in our prayer right now. I

said, I just want to point out what the, what the Lord is doing for you. And it just was such a beautiful reminder of, of his such tender love for us, you know?

[00:12:31] Michelle: [00:12:31] Mm, mm. And I think that book the, return to the prodigal son is just that constant reminder of the father's pursuit for all of us, that he is constantly pursuing us. Whether we feel like we're in the father's embrace already. Then he squeezing us even closer or if we feel like we are far off, he sees us in the distance.

[00:12:50] So wherever we are on the spectrum, he is just pursuing us and he is coming after us and he wants us to be an even deeper relationship with us. And that he is always continually inviting us to a deeper relationship with him. And, and I loved our time with, Matt Maher, like he is, you know, and I love, For someone that's known Matt for a long time, and I have to say something and people ask us a lot about guests for our podcast.

[00:13:16] And we really feel like the Holy Spirit has ordained to this podcast to be a brute of the, of our relationship and what we're learning personally in our spiritual life and how the three of us come together. And like it's an overflow. What the Lord is teaching us to teach you. We want to give you a fork and a knife, and to help you, we want to journey alongside you for you to grow , and for us to grow, we want to show you from our, you know, things that we've learned.

[00:13:40] A lot of times, things that we've made mistakes and growing and learning and. So the way we've heard things, but the majority of the time when we have guests, we don't feel like this podcast is one where we have a lot of interviews. So, we do have interviews, but the people that we do is because they speak to a theme that we really want to illuminate for you all in your growth or we have done life with these people, so like, the majority of all the priests, probably with exception of Bishop Barron, we do life with, we have relationships with our families, all those kinds of they're good dear brothers to us. And, our been really good spiritual fathers to us and with Matt also, like we've been in relationship with him for many, many years and watched his growth and watched his journey and watched his ability to worship grow and watch him live this unity and this tension, what does it mean to be the church being in unity with our protestant, brothers and sisters. And so the way in the power and just the humbleness that he spoke of and just really the reverence he spoke of, of the Eucharist and just that ache, we had some really good conversations before and after with him and our recording and it just, Oh, like a totally reverberate in my heart.

[00:14:49] Like this is the ache of the father that we are all one, and as a parent, you want all your children to get along and you want them to love each other and be. For one another. And it tells us in Psalms how beautiful it is when brothers dwell in unity. You know? So the father's heart is breaking with them where there's so much to see in a day, whether it be, right now it feels like the country and the world is so divided or would it be across races or denominations or whatever his heart is for unity and his heart is for peace.

[00:15:18] And, I really just feel like we need to lean on the father's chest and hear his heartbeat for that. And get in rhythm and alignment to bring that peace and bring that unity to the

[00:15:33]Sister Miriam: [00:15:33] Oh, yes. huh. I

[00:15:34] **Heather:** [00:15:34] Yeah yesterday. and he was, it was the Trinity Sunday and he was just saying, the Trinity is unity. They love perfectly, perfectly giving and generosity and love. And this is what we're made to image, is this unity everywhere in every circumstance

[00:15:50] and I think it's really, really important because it's racially, it's politically it's, you know, inter denominationally it's within our families. Like this touches every person and every part, no matter what your circumstances, and if we truly are to image the Trinity, then unity is at the forefront, love and unity is at the forefront.

[00:16:10] Sister, what are your thoughts?

[00:16:12] Sister Miriam: [00:16:12] and one thing that I was really particularly edified by, Matt Maher was just, you could tell the depth of how, how much he thought and prayed about these things. You know, and I think the last time I saw him in person, he was at a concert and people were screaming his name and he actually stopped.

[00:16:26] He was like, just please, can we just not do that? just stop. this is about the Lord. And I want him to be glorified. this is not about me. He's like so please, I appreciate it. He's like, please don't do that. You know? And I just listening to his, the richness of him, tell his story and you can tell, this is a man who has prayed and his pondered and his red in his reflected very, very deeply about these things. And it was just so edifying to hear somebody share from the reservoir of their intimacy with God and where they've been and their journey. I was so edified by it. it was really very uplifting and it just makes you want to dive deeper into those areas yourself.

[00:16:58] **Heather:** [00:16:58] Yeah, definitely. I also loved our conversation with Father Justin. He's been on twice now, a good friend of ours. he's an Exorcist. And the thing that I love is that he doesn't tell stories that like glorify the enemy he speaks about God's sovereignty so articulately, and so if you haven't listened to that episode or an in particular, the first one that we did with him, like those are wonderful, very meaty. Like he, it's a deep dive for sure. but yeah, I would, I would recommend that you go back and listen to those. And also, someone said to me in an email Hey, could you have more female guests on?

[00:17:34]it just seems like you guys just have priests and other guys, and they're great and I was like, Oh, we have had a lot of guys on this season, but in the past, actually we have about equal number of female guests as well. And they've just been at different times and it just happens to be, we don't plan it out that way.

Go back into the seasons over the summer, that's we're taking a break. So there's a lot of episodes, you know, this is seven seasons worth of, just wonderful content and great conversations.

learning how to love well, and then we, we dove into the Holy Spirit, of the divine mercy and then the Holy spirit and the fruits of the Holy spirit.

[00:18:22] And then Fr Jacques Philippe's book, which we obviously recently finished and we're going to take on our summer school course.

[00:18:28] Heather: [00:18:28] Yeah.

[00:18:30] Sister Miriam: [00:18:30] Of "in the school of the Holy Spirit" And I think, I really do think, and maybe this is like, you know, kind of a time we can talk about that is that that school, the Holy spirit is for a time such as this, for a time such as this. I was, you know, just this morning, praying for us and for the world and just, you know, asking the Holy spirit to come and give me the grace, I would say this is really, My heart for all of us and for our listeners, as we kind of go into this summer and just as very, so many things are happening and we don't know what's going to happen.

[00:18:55] And just that we must, we must stay close to Christ and we must choose. We must choose love. Like we must choose courage. We must choose what is good, true, and beautiful. We have to, and I was asking the Lord in a brand new way today. Jesus, give me your heart. Give me your heart so I can love you so I can love myself and I can love other people the way you love them.

My dear friends, I think social media right now is a dumpster fire.

Like that was the meme, but I was like, and it is so easy friends. It is so easy to make a comment and just go off. we must be very, very careful about that. Very careful.

[00:19:50] It would serve us all very well that you not only discern that one, two, three times before you post that, because it's sometimes a smallest comment that is just not helpful. like you both were saying at the beginning of the episode, you know, am I cultivating good seeds?

[00:20:02] And sometimes, you know, saying hard things is not easy that not saying not to say anything, but please let's let's I think we should all be very, the would be coming out of our mouth, what's in our hearts, you know, from the fullness of the heart, the mouth speaks.

[00:20:16] And to ask ourselves, is this really helpful? Is this really going to be helpful and then ask the, you know, to ask the Lord for like, Lord, give me your heart so I can see and love the way he loves. So I'm taking that very seriously myself and asking the Lord to, you know, illumine the ways in me where I'm an unwitting tool of the enemy out of my own self centeredness or my own self righteousness or my own like, I don't want to be an unwitting tool, the enemy, I want to be a tool of the Lord. And I don't mean that in like a useful purpose, but I mean, like, I want to be an instrument for goodness truth and beauty, and be able to stand firm in who Christ is and who he is in me and, and, and the world. Well, so I

think that for me would be my little fervorino for, all of our listeners this summer and, and something that I'm first and foremost, taking to heart myself and walking in that school as well.

[00:20:58] and we had done a podcast episode and season the, season before this past fall, last fall about social media and the power of words. And I would really go back to that previous season before this one and listen to that because, Heather was saying, you know, like she was singing in the shower would let there be peace on earth.

[00:21:14] and for another like cliche, Christian song, we sing at mass as but it's not a cliche. they know we are Christians by our love, and right now it looks like we know we're Christians by our division, because we are meant to unite what is divided and we are meant to be peacemakers blessed are the peacemakers because they are the children of God, but we have to have peace within ourselves.

[00:21:34] To bring peace to others. So that takes a lot of interior work. That takes a lot of, you know, and if we can't even map, like scripture tells us, we have to master our own tongues. And so when we see something and it strikes a nerve on, especially in social media that may this be an invitation to pray for that person before we comment on that person, may we learn the grace of a Holy pause to say, Lord, do not. Let me react, but help me respond. And this is where we need, like, Holy spirit, come be my advocate, be my counselor and be my teacher, and I think in these times, like there is a call that Florida's really stirring us.

[00:22:10] And I was telling the girls, I went to go visit one of em, you know, just a special person in our life. She's like become like a surrogate black grandmother to. All of us, but I mean, she's just a simple, prayerful powerhouse woman, you know, prayer warrior. And, we were just talking about everything that's going on.

[00:23:38] And the question really is, is Lord, like, how do you want me to respond to like, really like, Knowing that everyone has a story. How can I be a peacemaker, but also one that brings restoration, that the restoration that you are working in my own heart, overflows into the other relationships that I have.

[00:23:56] And I think for some people, we need to ask ourselves, like, even though I might be right with what I might say right now, maybe the greater discipline is for me to be quiet. And to listen, maybe that's what needs to be cultivated. It's not saying more, it's listening more.

[00:24:11] And I think these are all wonderful questions that we actually need to ask ourselves. And I hope friends, don't just listen to this podcast and be like, Oh, that was good. You know, but. But prayerfully, just sit before the Lord. Like, I love how father Josh has this thing, where with a lot of things, he's like, let's do a Lectio Divina about this.
